



K-4 STEM Updates

Kindergarten just finished their 5 Senses unit! They loved practicing STEM lab procedures as they explored sensory work stations with a focus on a different sense each week.

First grade completed a Magnetic Mars Rover unit! We explored magnetism, researched Mars, Diana Trujillo, and the Curiosity and Perseverance rovers, and then created our own magnetic rovers!

Second grade enjoyed a sound unit, which included hands-on (and ears-on!) research stations, an instrument engineering project, and some technology integration with the Chatterpix app.

Third grade completed a hot air balloon unit by creating their own robotic Hot Air Balloon Fiesta! Several weeks of research, experiments, and a helium balloon engineering challenge got them ready!

Fourth grade finished up their energy unit with a pool noodle roller coaster engineering pro-We explored potential and kinetic energy, gravity, centripetal force, and friction.

Current Initial Referrals (Child Find): 2

Expected to increase as the year progresses.

October State Deadlines based on the 2020-2021 fiscal year:

- Child Find (Indicator 11- 90 day timeline)- completed and certified prior to October 29 deadline
 - Total Certified/identified: 12 students ,with 1 extending beyond 90 days due to summer break and evaluators availability.
 - OF the 12 students: 8 found eligible for services, ,3 Non-eligible, 1 transferred during the process
- Maintenance of Effort Grant: Submitted prior to October 29th deadline.

School Counseling and SEL Updates

- Gittens delivered the Let's Talk About Mental Health presentation to all staff on August 12th.
- A new suicide screening protocol has been implemented to better identify, refer, follow-up with, and document students at risk of suicide.
- The Healthy Active Children's (HAC) policy report, which included The Improvement Plan for Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and School Mental Health (SMH) was submitted on September 15th.
- Resource guides for educators and parents have been created and are updated monthly to provide mental health, social-emotional, self-care, and counseling resources.
- All 8th grade students will receive a mental health presentation on December 14th.



School Counseling and SEL Updates

- Classroom Guidance lessons have been kicked into high gear and has been a really fun time with meaningful conversations
 - October is Bullying Awareness Month
 - School Wide we have learned the acronym "MOOO" (Mean,On purpose, Over and Over)to define and understand bullying behaviors.
 - Kinder/First: We read Howard B. Wigglebottom learns about Bullies
 - Second: We talked about different types of conflicts (disagreements, rude moment, mean moment, and bullying)
 - Third and Fourth: We are reading a 3 book series by Erin Frankel (Weird! Dare! Tough!) that tells the story of a ongoing case of bullying from three different perspectives; what to do in these situations
 - Fifth-Eighth: We are talking about the different types of bullying (Physical, Cyber, Social, Mental/Emotional, and Verbal)

- We hosted our first dance for 8th grade on Friday, Oct 22nd, called the Hoot and Howl Fest!
- We have a rescheduled Movie on the Lawn Night on Nov 10th!
- Middle school is planning a trip to San Francisco to attend a National STEM event and sightsee!

- 1st grade hosted a Family Tree event and did a really great job creating and showcasing family trees to their peers.
